The January minutes were approved with no questions or objections.

7:05, Introduction to discussion on long-term substitutes (Paige Tucker, Dimar Brown, Katie Cochran)

Paige Tucker and Dimar Brown from Human Resources outlined the current use of substitute teachers and employment trends at APS.

Teachers: Overall, APS rate of teacher employment is very good. One challenge area is Special Education teachers, who have been about a third of this year's teacher resignations. APS also has a sub-to-teacher program to help substitutes become full teachers.

Substitutes: APS holds monthly substitute recruitment fairs with about 30 attendees at each. The school system is offering higher pay to substitutes this year vs last year and has increased the number of school-based substitutes to 2-4 per school. There is jncentive pay on "hot days" (days substitutes are needed urgently), and APS has 6% more substitutes active per day over last year.

Two groups, elementary and secondary, discussed the issues concerning long-term substitutes in their schools and generated questions to get community feedback.
